through recycling, and hauled 140 tons of waste to the landfill. In 2018, we diverted 54 tons of material through recycling and hauled 136 tons of waste to the landfill. This growth is really exciting,

because in 2018 we conducted three major clean up operations on the reservation, resulting in an additional 19 tons of trash. Not including this amount, collected trash for 2018 comes down to 117 tons, and means we achieved 32% recycling!
