Zero Waste Kitchen Tips

Choose cloth napkins instead of paper napkins.

Break out the real dishes instead of using paper plates.

Use a reusable coffee filter or French press instead of disposable filters (compost your coffee grounds).

Use reusable tea bags or a tea infuser instead of disposable tea bags, (or compost your tea bags).

Ditch plastic Tupperware and use glass or stainless steel food containers.

Switch from sponges to reusable sponges or natural scrub brush.

Give reusable wraps a try instead of plastic wrap to keep food fresh.

Opt for reusable sandwich bags instead of plastic bags.

While "zero waste" is not a new concept, many people and business owners misunderstand the approach to be "all or nothing." In reality, it can be a gradual, slow, imperfect process. See below:
